

HEBREW AND GREEK WORDS FOR SATAN

Satan - H7854 - śâṭân

an *opponent*; especially (with the article prefixed) *Satan*, the arch enemy of good: - adversary, Satan, withstand.

Satan - G4567 - Satanas

the accuser, that is, the *devil*: - Satan.

Devil - G1228 - diabolos

a *traducer* (To cause humiliation or disgrace to by making malicious and false statements.); specifically *Satan* (compare [H7854]): - false accuser, devil, slanderer.

Lucifer. (*light-bearer*). H1966 - hêylêl

From H1984 (in the sense of *brightness*); the *morning star*: - lucifer. H1984 - hâlâl - A primitive root; to *be clear* (originally of sound, but usually of color); to *shine*; hence to *make a show*; to *boast*; and thus to *be* (clamorously) *foolish*; to *rave*; causatively to *celebrate*; also to *stultify*: - (make) boast (self), celebrate, commend, (deal, make), fool (-ish, -ly), glory, give [light], be (make, feign self) mad (against), give in marriage, [sing, be worthy of] praise, rage, renowned, shine.

The enemy will wear you down with accusations, seductions, and temptations. He will accuse and send a spirit of fear against you.

Lucifer was created perfect in all his ways, but iniquity was found in him. It was *not* put there by God. Lucifer created it. (Ezekiel 28:15)

Like man, the angels were created perfect, and with a free will.

Satan was lifted up because of his beauty, he corrupted the wisdom by reason of his brightness (Ezekiel 28:17)

Lucifer, Satan and the Devil are three different names for the same angel. Lucifer refers to this angel when he lived in heaven. Satan and the Devil are names for this angel after he became evil and came to our earth.
